



## Lady Margaret School Summary of Online Provision

From January 2021 students in all year groups return to working from home.

There is ongoing provision on site for the children of key workers and students in vulnerable groups. Heads of Year and the Senior Leadership Team monitor and support this group.

Students in all year groups continue to follow a full curriculum as follows:

Year group	Subjects studied
7	English, Maths, Science, French, Spanish, History, Geography, RS, Art, Music, DT, PE

10	Almost all students follow the EBACC: GCSEs in English Language, English Literature, Maths, Science (Combined or Triple award), French or Spanish, History or Geography. All students study GCSE RS. Students take an additional GCSE option subject (DT, Music, Drama, Art of another EBACC subject). All students have PSHE lessons. Curriculum Support lessons are available for students not taking the full EBACC suite of subjects.

Students have the full amount of online learning each day of 5 hours for students in Key Stages 3 & 4. Students in Key Stage 5 have online learning for all of their A Level lessons.

As a school, we have a 'blended' approach to online learning, in line with recommendations from the Department for Education and from Ofsted. This means that students in all year groups will have a range of learning experience whilst studying at home. This will support students in developing their independent learning skills as well as opportunities for high quality input from staff and for group work and discussion online.

Staff set work with clear instructions on Show My Homework every morning by 8.40am for lessons timetabled for that day. The Deputy Headteacher (Curriculum), checks postings each day to ensure that all work has been uploaded.

Where live learning is due to take place, links to Zoom meetings or to Google Meet lessons will be either posted in Google Classroom or sent via school email. A clear set of protocols for using Zoom or Google Meet has been shared with staff, students and parents/carers.

Attendance to live lessons is compulsory and a system is in place for monitoring attendance online as well as non-completion of work.

The Senior Leadership Team and Middle Leaders have worked on portfolio documents which outline which work will be formally assessed by teaching staff over the Spring Term 2021 for all year groups. This will mean that all students and staff are clear about expectations for assessment this term.

These arrangements are in place to ensure that students can engage in learning fully whilst working at home and can be supported by their teachers to do so. This plan will also support students returning to learning in school when we are able to open fully and safely.
